Foreign Language Clubs to be Offered in the Fall

This year there were six after-school language clubs sponsored by the PTA. Due to the success of the program, plans are underway to continue the Spanish and French clubs in the 2008-2009 school year. There is also the possibility of adding a German club.

Three of the Spanish teachers are leaving, so new ones will be recruited. There will be a limit of 15 students per club, with 1st and 2nd graders grouped together and 3rd, 4th and 5th graders grouped together. There will also be more advanced groups for the students with experience. Feedback from this year's participants will be incorporated into next year's program. The goal of the program is to accommodate everyone who wants to participate, if possible.

Even with the myriad of other after school activities available, there has been a lot of interest in convenient, affordable language classes. One reason could be that increased globalization is leading parents to prioritize learning about other languages and cultures. These after-school language offerings add an important element to the standard curriculum at an age when children find it easier to learn.

Registration will take place after school begins in the fall. However, to be better prepared in terms of teachers and space, we would like an indication now of the level of interest in the clubs. While this year the PTA planned for only two clubs, the program quickly expanded to include six clubs in order to meet the overwhelming demand.

Help us avoid a similar delay next year by letting us know now if your student is interested in participating next year. If you have any questions or if we have not heard about your interest in enrolling, please contact Heidi Bunes at heidibunes@comcast.net. Please include any days that are definitely unworkable and which language club is preferred.

TV Turnoff Week is a Success!

One hundred and two children completed the PTA challenge and earned a certificate and Uncle Wiggly's coupon. The most participants were 1st graders, followed by kindergartners and 3rd graders. Many parents sent comments about the experience and highlighted the benefits of the exercise. For example:

"We did it! My son wakes up real early everyday and likes to watch Sports Center. He learned to read the sports page a lot more this week than usual."

"My son balked at first, but found lots of alternative activities – which got us all moving! A full day of the stomach bug on Saturday was a tempting excuse - but he was committed to the cause. Today (Sunday) he cleaned up the basement playroom without prodding or assistance. What a wonderful experience for me (and the rest of the family)."

"We extended this to all screen time as computer use is more popular than TV watching in our household."

"My daughter found herself reading more books and got ideas for creating pictures. She was also faster in completing tasks and chores."

"Fourth year we have participated. Luckily we had great weather and spent good time together as a family playing outside, taking walks and playing board games."

"We don't watch much TV, but we do watch videos. It was hardest on me. My kids did not miss it at all."

"My son enjoyed finding alternatives to TV: playing outside (golf and baseball), fishing, trains, art and talking. We are very proud."

Next year TV Turnoff week is April 20-26, 2009. We plan to challenge Rodgers Forge Elementary. Please plan to join us.

ATTENTION PARENTS!

Effective June 30, 2008, all children up to the age of 8* must ride in a car seat or booster seat. All children up to the age of 16 must wear a seat belt or car seat/booster seat in every seating position in the car.

(* unless the child weighs 65 lbs or stands 4'9" tall).

Remember, car crashes are the leading cause of unintentional injury or death in children! Most crashes occur within 10 minutes of home!

It is BEST/SAFEST to wait until a child actually fits the car seat belt before moving him/her out of a booster seat. Before moving into the seat belt, every child 8 years and older should pass the '5 Step Test':

1. Can the child sit all the way back on the vehicle seat (back and bottom touching)?
2. Can the child bend his/her knees over the seat edge?
3. Does the lap portion of the belt touch the upper thighs or hips (not the soft belly)?
4. Does the shoulder portion of the belt cross mid-chest and rest on the shoulder blade?
5. Can the child stay like this the entire ride?

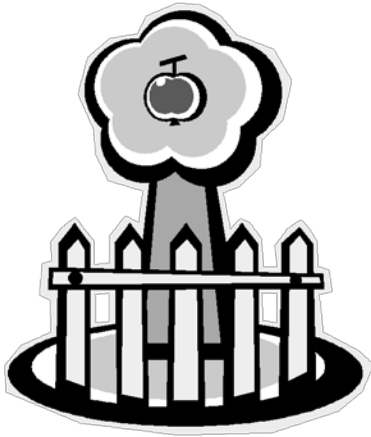

Ensuring the safety of children is a primary parenting concern. That's why the National PTA and the Stoneleigh Elementary School PTA both support the **TAKE 25 Campaign**, which encourages parents to take time to talk to their kids about staying safe. Put child safety at the top of your to-do list in honor of National Missing Children's Day, hosted annually by the [National Center for Missing & Exploited Children®](#).

The National PTA's list of 25 ways your family can help kids stay safe can be found at www.pta.org/archive_article_details_1174067898656.html. Below are Stoneleigh Elementary PTA's 15 favorite safety action items for your family:

1. Teach your children how and when to use 911, and make sure they have a trusted adult to call if they're scared or have an emergency.
2. Check your children's online screen names to make sure they don't reveal too much about your children. At the same time, caution children not to post revealing information or inappropriate photos of themselves or their friends online. Make sure online predators don't have information they could use to manipulate your children into thinking they are trusted friends.
3. Know what other access your children may have to the Internet—at school, at the library, or at friends' homes.
4. Adapt the [NetSmartz® Internet Safety Pledge](#) for each of your children. Sign the pledges and post them next to the computer or in another prominent place as a reminder. (See www.netsmartz.org/resources/pledge.htm for the pledge.)
5. Teach your children to ask you before leaving home and to stay with a friend whenever they're playing outside or walking anywhere.
6. Make sure your children know how to reach you at work and on your cell phone.
7. Set up "what if" situations and ask your children how they would respond. "What if someone asked you to help them find a lost puppy? What would you do?"
8. Explore [NetSmartz® Kids](#) at www.netsmartzkids.org with your children.
9. Walk the route to and from school with your children, pointing out landmarks and safe places to go if they're being followed or need help. If your children ride a bus to school, visit the bus stop with them to make sure they know which bus to take.
10. Teach younger children their full names, address, and telephone numbers. All children should also know their parents' and guardians' full names.
11. Teach your children that if anyone tries to grab them, they should make a scene and make every effort to get away by kicking, screaming, and resisting. Set up role-play situations at home to practice.
12. Remind your children about the household rules regarding having visitors over when you are not at home. Role-play with your children how to answer the phone when they are home alone.
13. Talk to your children about the importance of not approaching any vehicle, occupied or not, unless they know the owner and are accompanied by a parent, guardian, or other trusted adult.
14. Explain to your children to stay away from pools and other bodies of water without adult supervision. All pools your children visit should have a visible lifeguard on duty. If you have a pool at home, establish appropriate swimming hours and supervision.
15. Teach your children how to locate help at theme parks, sports stadiums, shopping malls, and other public places. Identify those people who are safe to ask for help, such as law enforcement, security guards, and store clerks with name tags. Make it a point to practice each time you take a trip; quiz your children on the things they should look for.

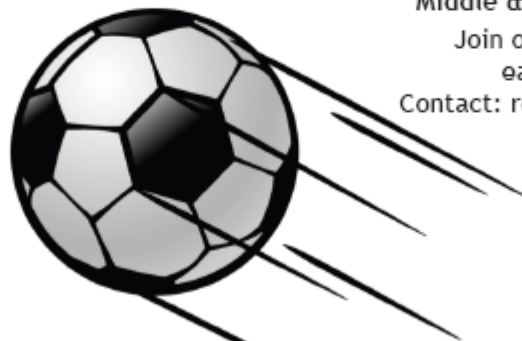
